Bancroft Library, University of California, Berkeley.

California Historical Society, North Baker Research Library, 678 Mission Street, San Francisco.

California Room, California State Library, Sacramento.

City of Davis, City Clerk's Office. Has originals of minutes and resolutions of the city government.

City of Davis, Historical Resources Management Commission materials housed in the Community Development Department, Davis City Hall.

City of Davis, Public Works Department drafting and mapping section. Has an especially good drawer of old Davis maps and two sets of original Sanborn maps.

Davis Branch of the Yolo County Public Library. In addition to parts of the Larkey Collection, listed separately, it has a number other important history items in its locked history case.

Davis Senior High School Craig Armstrong Library. Has a collection of Davis High School yearbooks.

Giannini Map Room, University of California Berkeley.

Government Documents Department, Shields Library, UC Davis. For many years, the City of Davis has sent copies of its most important documents to this Department.

Hattie Weber Museum of Davis, Fifth and C streets, Davis.
